## How the course works

## Using an AI Buddy (the right way)

AI can help you **brainstorm steps, polish tone, shorten drafts, and plan practice blocks.**

It must **not** be used to **fake work, share private info, or impersonate others.** You are always the thinker and doer.

## Helpful prompts you can try:

- “Suggest a 25-minute Pomodoro plan for revising chapter 3 with 5 tiny steps.”
- “Rewrite this paragraph to sound confident but respectful (≤40 words).”

- “Give me 3 empathy sentences I can use when a teammate is frustrated.”

## How you’ll be assessed

- **Weekly journals & check-ins** (short but consistent)
- **Practice artifacts** (scripts, slides, trackers, challenge plan)
- **Mini leadership activity** (Week 4)
- **21-Day Personal Challenge** (Week 7 project)
- **Final Growth Story** (Week 10): “Who I became in 10 weeks”

*Certificate criteria:* Minimum 8/10 modules completed, 21-Day plan submitted, final reflection/presentation delivered.

## Support if you get stuck

- **Ask early:** Teachers/mentors can help you break tasks into tiny steps
- **Peer buddy:** Pair up for weekly check-ins
- **Office hours/Q&A thread:** Bring specific questions (“I’m stuck at step 2 because...”)

## Code of Character (our class culture)

- **Kindness first:** We assume good intent and repair quickly when needed
- **Brave practice:** We try new skills in small, safe steps
- **Privacy & safety:** We don’t share personal details or screenshots without permission
- **Growth mindset:** Progress over perfection—learn, iterate, repeat
